TCB's Undergraduate Scholarship Programme 2014

Tasek Corporation Berhad (TCB) has embarked on yet another *Corporate Responsibility* initiative and this time TCB is offering scholarships to needy students with good academic performance in enabling them to pursue full-time undergraduate Degree courses. Apart from providing students with scholarships to further their studies, TCB will be able to build pool of graduate engineers that is readily available for employment in the near future.

The selection process is based on a set of criteria, short listing and screening process by a panel of interviewers from TCB where eligibility of recipients are based mainly on their academic excellence, financial affordability etc. For year 2014, TCB has made offer to three successful undergraduate applicants to receive scholarships that valued up to RM36,000 for a 4-year Degree course.
